Dr. Speidell (Ph.D. Fuller Theological Seminary) serves as the Editor of *Participatio: The Journal of the Thomas F. Torrance Theological Fellowship*. His most recent book is *Fully Human in Christ: The Incarnation as the End of Christian Ethics*. He has served as editor, contributor or co-editor of several books including *Trinity and Transformation: J.B. Torrance's Vision of Worship, Mission, and Society; T. F. Torrance and Eastern Orthodoxy: Theology in Reconciliation*; and *Incarnational Ministry: The Presence of Christ in Church, Society, and Family.* Now retired, he has most recently served as Director of Education for Acadia Healthcare Corporation and Instructor in Theology at Montreat College.







July 31 - August 2, 2020

Registered participants for the Torrance Workshop-Retreat included 126 people from every inhabited continent, including the following countries: Australia, Brazil, Canada, England, France, India, Japan, Kuwait, New Zealand, Nigeria, Norway, Puerto Rico,

Scotland, Singapore, South Korea, and the United States.

Average attendance over 9 sessions (both synchronous and asynchronous) was 75 people per session.

During the Workshop-Retreat, 9 books were given away, courtesy of Wipf & Stock, Lexham Publishers, T&T Clark, and Fortress Press, and discount codes were provided to all participants for special orders.

Although there are no session recordings, the <u>program</u> remains available on the website.
