Researchers interested in engaging the theology of T. F. Torrance may submit manuscripts in accordance with the policies specified below. Contributions from diverse disciplines and perspectives will be encouraged to explore the wide-ranging significance of Torrance's legacy. Occasional miscellaneous issues will include paper presentations and responses from the annual conference, book reviews, etc. For more information see participatio.org.

POLICIES FOR MANUSCRIPT SUBMISSION:

1. Electronic submission of articles (using a Microsoft Word attachment) should be sent to the Editor (email at top of next page). Please do not submit a manuscript previously published or being considered for publication by another journal.
2. Please use the *Participatio* template with its pre-set paragraph styles and adhere to the *Participatio* Style Guide. Find these at tftorrance.org: click the Participatio tab, then "For Authors and Editors," then "Submission Guidelines" and "Style Guide." The Style Guide covers formatting matters such as: Include a title page with: i. title of the article; ii. your name and highest degree; iii. your institutional affiliation and position; iv. your electronic mail address. Include an abstract of 100-200 words and a total approximate range of 5,000-10,000 words. Use footnotes rather than endnotes. *Participatio* does not employ a copy editor. Your manuscript will be returned to you if it requires copy editing, does not use the template paragraph styles, or does not conform to the *Participatio* Style Guide. Consult with the editor whenever formatting questions arise.
3. All submitted manuscripts will be acknowledged promptly and processed as quickly as possible.
